- [I] It's quite obvious the revels are held by the Fey. If you need more help determining this, see the attached list. The Fey here have an aversion to charms made with brightly-colored buckeye seeds.
- [2] The blue liquid is some kind of medicinal draught. Their healers seem to think jabbing one's arms with crystals will heal it, so I wouldn't be surprised if the draught contains pulverized quartz as well.
- [3] AKA "anyone who follows a religion other than the Empire's"
- [4] It was unclear whether the villagers were happy about or even aware of their childrens' night-time excursions. Most likely some of the entertainers' children were caught up in this as well.

Six signs you're dealing with the Fey

- 1. Laughter and merriment in the forest at night
- 2. A beautiful lady playing a quartz flute
- 3. Midnight chefs preparing rare delicacies in total silence
- 4. A lifelike statue of a child cupping a hunk of quartz, entwined in vines
- 5. Folk with green hair and eyes repeatedly offering you strange food and drink
- 6. Hissing in response to dyed buckeye charms
